DEPARTURE: Meet Saturday 6:30 a.m. Mar 20th in St. Ignatius parking lot. We will leave at 7:00 a.m. We will not stop for breakfast. Contact leadership if you need alternative arrangements. We will return Sunday, Mar 21st. Please provide driver information for the tour permit (vehicle info, DL no., liability ins. amounts).

PROGRAM: We will drive straight to the museum, arriving around 10:30 a.m. We will spend most of the day at the museum and check out some of the numerous objects on display including the Enterprise (space shuttle), Enola Gay (the bomber that dropped the first atomic bomb), Concorde (was fastest passenger jet), Mars Sojourner Rover Model (copy of what is now on Mars), and many other amazing artifacts and exhibits - <http://www.nasm.si.edu/museum/udvarhazy/>. Around 4:00-5:00 p.m., we will drive about 15 min from the museum to the park and set up camp and cook dinner. The scouts will determine the Saturday evening and Sunday morning activities. Sunday morning we will have breakfast, pack-up, possibly stop at a civil war battlefield for an hour or two, and then head for home.

EQUIPMENT: Bring personal camping gear including 10 essentials (including rain gear and mess kit, see handbook). Tents will be provided. Patrols will need to make sure their grub boxes are complete. Be prepared for early spring weather. Average: 56/33F. Wear Class A uniform for travel.

COST: Patrol food expense: bring \$10 to the March 16 Troop and give it to your patrol Grub Master for Saturday dinner and Sunday breakfast. Bring cash for lunch at museum. Be prepared to share travel expenses: gas (~\$30-50/car), toll road (~\$25?/car), and museum parking (\$15/car). Museum is free.

COOKING: Patrol-based cooking with chuck box equipment: Saturday dinner and Sunday breakfast. Adults will eat with the patrols, but the scouts will do the planning, cooking, and cleanup.
